IPDP Goal Creation Detailed Explanation

- You must have 3 goals.
- Each goal must include four distinct aspects: (1) intention to engage in learning; (2) focus for learning; (3) rationale and application of learning; and (4) activities to reach your goal.
- The goals must include Educator Standards 1 through 6.
- The following two samples show examples of goals with all 4 aspects and that meet more than one educator standard.
- These 2 examples do not include all of the educator standards. You are required to create 3 goals, even though there are only 2 samples.

Sample Goal 1: "I will increase my knowledge of strategies to manage groups of students in order to improve classroom discipline by attending workshops."

The relationship between the four aspects of the goal and sample goal 1 are as follows:

- 1. Intention to engage in learning: I will increase my knowledge of strategies
- 2. Focus for learning: to manage groups of students
- 3. Rationale and application of learning: in order to improve classroom discipline
- 4. Activities to reach your goal: by attending workshops.

Educator standards met:

Standard 5: Teachers create learning environments that promote high levels of learning and achievement for all students.

Standard 1: Teachers understand student learning and development and respect the diversity of the students they teach.

Sample Goal 2: "I will learn new strategies to teach and assess math concepts in order to improve student learning by taking courses, and attending workshops."

The relationship between the four aspects of the goal and sample goal 2 are as follows:

- 1. Intention to engage in learning: I will learn new strategies
- 2. Focus for learning: to teach and assess math concepts
- 3. Rationale and application of learning: in order to improve student learning
- 4. Activities to reach your goal: by taking courses and attending workshops.

Educator standards met:

Standard 2: Teachers know and understand the content area for which they have instructional responsibility.

Standard 3: Teachers understand and use varied assessments to inform instruction, evaluate and ensure student learning.

Standard 4: Teachers plan and deliver effective instruction that advances the learning of each individual student.
